Fibre To The Premise

FTTP (Fibre to the Premise) is a fibre broadband connection direct to the premise, without copper or cabinet interruption.

With the regular broadband 'fibre' services that you will currently receive (superfast internet if you're with one of the higher speed services), the fibre is taken to a cabinet in the street before it then takes itself along to your premise or building. At the cabinet, a copper phone line will then take the fibre connection to your building and it is unfortunately the copper in the line that will slow down your connection.

With FTTP, there is no copper interruption - the fibre line will be installed direct to your premise, so you will be receiving an uninterrupted, better quality, speedier connection.

What does that mean for my voice services?
